1. **NOUN.** arrangement to have a room, a seat, etc., held in advance for your use later on:
We made a ___ for a room in that hotel.
2. **NOUN.** land set aside by the government for a special purpose:
The Navajo Indian ___ is near the desert..

NOUN. a military rank below general.

VERB. gives as an effect or a result; provides; yields:
Reading a good book ___ real pleasure.

VERB. moving about in a secret and sly manner:

Several people were seen ___ near the house before it was robbed.

NOUN. a gleam; flash:

The ___ in her eye showed that she was angry.

ADJECTIVE. strange or odd in an interesting, pleasing, or amusing way:

Many old photographs seem ___ to us today.

1. **NOUN.** a thin board, usually oval or oblong, with a thumb hole at one end, used by painters to lay and mix colors on.
2. **NOUN.** set of colors used by a painter.

NOUN. a frame to support weight.

NOUN. similar appearance; likeness:
Twins often show great ___.

VERB. to bend:

She will ___ her stiff arm slowly.

1. **NOUN.** the force acting on an object in motion, in a direction opposite to the object's motion. It is produced by friction.
2. **VERB.** to pull or move along heavily or slowly; pull or draw along the ground:
We will ___ those heavy boxes out of the garage.

NOUN. buildings for storing aircraft.

NOUN. aircraft without an engine. Rising air currents keep it up in the air.

VERB. stopped or brought to a standstill, usually against your wish:

The airplane engine ____, and we parachuted to safety.

NOUN. a flat piece of wood or metal hinged vertically to the rear end of an aircraft or boat and used to steer it.

NOUN. the enclosed front section of a rocket made to carry instruments, astronauts, etc., into space. In flight, this section can separate from the rest of the rocket and go into orbit or be directed back to Earth.

NOUN. pilots or members of the crew of a spacecraft.

NOUN. line where the Earth and sky seem to meet; skyline. You cannot see beyond this.

1. **NOUN.** a trapdoor covering an opening in an aircraft's or ship's deck.

2. **VERB.** to come out of an egg:

That chicken egg will ____ today.

3. **VERB.** to keep an egg or eggs warm until the young come out:

The sun's heat will hatch the turtle's eggs.

NOUN. a self-contained unit or system within a larger system, often designed for a particular function:

The lunar ___ circled the moon.

ADJECTIVE. of, like, or about the moon:
The ___ landscape is very drab and full of craters.

NOUN. detention, isolation, and other measures taken to prevent the spread of an infectious disease.
