Kindergarten: We've been busy in the art room this winter in Kindergarten. We have made our first clay artwork, a pinch pot that we molded and shaped with our hands by pinching. We also learned about famous abstract action painter Jackson Pollock and painted with marbles while moving. And we have been learning how to draw a self-portrait.

First Grade: First graders used clay to create ceramic snowmen. Students also learned about famous artist Michelangelo and studied his Sistine Chapel artworks. They learned that Michelangelo lay on his back and painted over his head and so students tried this out themselves. They taped paper under their desks and drew over their heads. They found out this was not easy!

Second Grade: Second graders made Angry Bird rattles out of clay. They painted and decorated their birds in a variety of fun colors and added feathers and google eyes.

Third Grade: Third graders created silly fish out of clay. They were allowed to add as many silly features as they liked, such as tongues, teeth, extra eyes, etc. They painted their fish in bright vivid colors.

Fourth Grade: Fourth graders created an ancient Egyptian Tablet out of clay. They decorated the tablet with a pharaoh, queen or Egyptian god. They added lots of colors and beads to complete the project.



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STUDENT COUNCIL SPREADS KINDNESS

Protsman Student Council sponsored Random Act of Kindness month during the month of February. Each grade level thanked different awesome staff members in our school. During our last meeting, students were read *Each Kindness* by Jacqueline Woodson. This book is a story that teaches a powerful lesson on being kind to one another. The author mentions that when you are kind to someone, it's a "ripple effect" like throwing a stone into water. Our student council members realized that it's important to be kind today because you don't know if there will be a tomorrow. As student leaders, members came up to the bowl of water, mentioned something that they had done that was kind that morning, and put their stone in the water to watch the "ripple effect".



KARATE RECORDERS

This quarter the fourth grade classes have been working through the Recorder Karate book. The colors of the belt match the difficulty level of each musical exercise, just like in real karate. Students begin at the white belt level and work their way towards a black belt. 


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PRESERVATION PARK BY MISS THOMAS

During the first half of the school year third grade students learned about everything environmental and Green. Students studied energy conservation, ways to prevent pollution, types of soil and erosion and how to limit our use of Earth's precious natural resources. After studying these topics students worked in groups to solve a fictitious real world problem. Queen Anne's island is in trouble. The water is being polluted, the natural resources are being used up, the soil is eroding and the air is getting harder to breathe. Students created a plan, made a 3D model of their park and presented their design, goals and plan to a panel of judges made up of parent volunteers. The students worked really hard on these projects and were able to show what they learned through this final project.



FLATBOAT PROJECTS

Fourth grade students were given "blueprints and lumber" when they returned to school in January. The class also read the book *The Floating House* to learn about a flatboat traveling pioneers and to get design ideas. Students' flatboat creations are displayed in Protsman School's display cases near the entrance.




ADDING MORE WINS
